## 1 Why do we have this document

This document describes our views of the changes in the 2 versions of the ISO9001 standard, to assist our Clients and our Client Managers. It also presents the requirements published by ISO and JASANZ on upgrades of certifications and impacts on certifications.

## 2 Background

ISO (the International Standards Organisation) published on the 13<sup>th</sup> November 2008 the new version of the ISO9001 Standard: ISO9001 - 2008 which now supersedes the ISO9001 - 2000 version.

JAS-ANZ (The Joint Accreditation System of Australia and New Zealand) published Policy 07/08 - ISO9001: 2000 to ISO9001: 2008 TRANSITION POLICY. This policy governs the Certification Companies in Australia and New Zealand, like Global-Mark, and also organisations in Australia and New Zealand Certified under the JAS-ANZ rules to ISO9001.

## 3 Scope

This Guide applies to all Clients Certified to:

- AS/NZS ISO9001-2000
- AS/NZS ISO9001-2000: incorporating the Private Sector Quality Criteria
- AS/NZS ISO 9001-2000: incorporating the Core Standards for Safety and Quality in Healthcare
- AS/NZS ISO 9001-2000 & the Guide to the Registered Automotive Workshop Scheme

## 4 JAS-ANZ Transition Policy

Accredited certification to the ISO 9001:2008 shall not be granted until the publication of ISO 9001:2008 as an International Standard.

Certification of conformity to ISO 9001:2008 and/or national equivalents shall only be issued after official publication of ISO 9001:2008 (13 November 2008) and **after a routine surveillance or recertification audit** against ISO 9001:2008.

**Validity of certifications to ISO 9001:2000**

**One year** after publication of ISO 9001:2008 all accredited certifications issued (new certifications or recertifications) shall be to ISO 9001:2008.

**Twenty four months** after publication by ISO of ISO 9001:2008, any existing certification issued to ISO 9001:2000 shall not be valid.

## 5 Comparison on the standards

ISO have recognized that ISO 9001:2008 introduces no new requirements.

ISO 9001:2008 only introduces clarifications to the existing requirements of ISO 9001:2000 based on eight years of experience of implementing the standard world wide with about one million certificates issued in 170 countries to date.

It also introduces changes intended to improve consistency with ISO14001:2004 (Environmental Management System Requirements)
